

# A Bibliography of the History of Inland Waterways, Railways and Roads in the British Isles, 1985

The objective of the R&CHS Bibliography Project is to produce an annual bibliography (of which this is the first), followed in due course by a cumulative volume. The latter will be extended backwards to run continuously from the forthcoming second volume of George Ottley's *A bibliography of British railway history*, Mark Baldwin's 'A bibliography of British canals, 1623-1950', and the *Journal of Transport History*'s annual bibliography of transport history in British periodicals for the years 1950-78.

The aim is to provide comprehensive coverage within the following boundaries:

## Subjects covered

Inland waterways—river navigations and canals.

Railways, including early tramroads, street tramways, and associated services operated by railway companies (road, shipping, docks, air, hotels).

Road transport history (but not the history of road vehicles, other than horse-drawn and early steam-powered vehicles). As no specialist contributor has been found for this subject, this section of the bibliography does not yet include books.

In all fields the geographical coverage is the British Isles; however works on overseas subjects (including wartime operations) in which the British contribution is a key feature are also included.

## Sources covered

Inland waterway and railway books and booklets, including contemporaneous works. Specialist technical works and juvenile literature are excluded.

Books on related subjects which include a noteworthy contribution to one of the primary subjects.

*Modern Railways* (MR); *Modern Tramways* (MT); *Railway Magazine* (RM); *Railway World* (RW); *Waterways World* (WW).

National/regional journals in the fields of archaeology (12), history (31), geography (4) and industrial archaeology (6).

County/local journals in the fields of archaeology/history (89) and industrial archaeology (12).

Theses (extracted from Index to theses (ASLIB)).

Government publications (selective; items likely to become of value to transport historians only).

For all periodicals, short items (less than one page in length), correspondence (unless referring to an article which has been included) and book reviews (unless adding materially to the content of the book) are excluded. In the case of periodicals marked \* only historical articles are noticed (but including articles which give an historical treatment to recent events).

It will be noted that all books have been included—even those not of an historical nature—whereas the bibliography of periodical literature is confined to historical articles. This is recognised to be inconsistent. However the practice in regard to books has been determined by the wish to continue George Ottley's work, whereas practical considerations have inevitably restricted the coverage of periodical articles.

The railway section of the bibliography is classified in accordance with Ottley's classification and similar systems have been devised for the other sections. Cross-references to entries in Ottley's first volume are indicated thus: 'Ott.xxxx'.

This first bibliography has been compiled from contributions from the following members: Dr Mark Baldwin (inland waterway books), Grahame Boyes, John Gough (East Midlands), Richard Graham (Hertfordshire), Dr Michael Lewis (Archaeology journals), Don Martin (Scotland), Michael Messenger (Devon/Cornwall), Neil Pitts (Ireland), Paul Reynolds (Wales; government publications; theses), Donald Steggles (railway books; railway society journals) and Peter Wakelin (West Midlands). David Croft, a non-member, has kindly contributed the electric tramway items.

In order to keep production costs within budget it has been found necessary to adopt a small typeface, which it is hoped users will not find too tiresome. Also the following material has been excluded (although noted for inclusion in the cumulative volume): government publications; railway preservation; yearbooks and annual publications; some photographic albums with little or no textual content.

There will inevitably be omissions in this initial supplement. In particular the publications of minor publishers and non-transport books with a transport interest can easily slip through the net. Members are asked to check for omissions, particularly of these more obscure items, and to advise the editor so that they can be included in next year's issue and in the cumulative volume.

It has been the aim to inspect a copy each book listed, to ensure accuracy of the details recorded and to provide an explanatory comment where the title is not itself sufficiently self-explanatory. However, in the case of books marked †, the details have been taken from a secondary source. Members with access to these works are asked to check the entries, i.e. author and title (with sub-title) as on the title page, place of publication, publisher, year of publication, pagination, details of illustrations and, if appropriate, a succinct comment, and to send details to the editor.

Warm acknowledgement is given to George Ottley, whose immense service to transport historians has been both an inspiration to the compilers and a guide to how it should be done, and who first proposed that the Society should undertake this venture. Thanks are also offered to the various libraries whose services have been used and to the London bookshops of David & Charles and Motor Books, who have permitted lengthy perusal of their extensive stocks.
