

# A Bibliography of the History of Inland Waterways, Railways and Roads in the British Isles, 1986

This is the second annual bibliography produced by the R&CHS Bibliography Project. Its scope, in terms of subjects and sources covered, was explained in the introduction to the 1985 Bibliography, published in the November 1986 issue of the *Journal*. One change has been made to the classification system: books/articles on individual tramways are now gathered together in class RD1, rather than dispersed in class RC. Although nominally a bibliography of material published in 1986, it includes some 1985 items which have come to notice since then, partly as a result of additional periodicals being searched (216 titles are now covered).

As before, in order to keep production costs within budget, the following material has been excluded (although noted for inclusion in the cumulative volume): government publications; railway preservation; some railway photographic albums with little or no textual comment or value for historical evidence. For the same reason the small typeface has been retained. For those who find this a difficulty, it is suggested that they make an enlarged photocopy. (It will cost less than the charge which would have been necessary if the normal type size had been used.)
