A Bibliography of the History of Inland Waterways, Railways and Road Transport in the British Isles, 1994

As time goes on, access to the data contained in these annual bibliographies (of which this is the ninth) becomes increasingly troublesome. It was always the hope that they could be consolidated into one or more cumulative volumes. We are pleased to announce the first step towards this aim; the means have been found to publish a second supplement to George Ottley's A bibliography of British railway history, which will list new titles and new editions of older works published during the years 1981-94. It will thus cover the 'missing' years before the annual bibliographies commenced, together with two classes of material that have hitherto been omitted in order to limit the number of pages taken up each year in the Journal: books (mainly guides) dealing with railway preservation and museums; and contemporaneous reports and papers of an 'official' nature. The latter have tended to grow in recent years, with increasing activity by local authority 'transportation' departments and, of course, an entirely new corpus of literature on the privatisation of British Railways. In time these will become significant primary source material for transport historians.

Work on this volume is in hand, so now is the time to submit details of more obscure items that we might have missed, such as works on local or business history with a significant railway content of value to railway historians.

Meanwhile this bibliography follows its usual pattern. Ott.xxxx refers to an entry in Ottley's bibliography. † indicates that a copy of the book has not been seen and the bibliographical details are uncertain. The usual thanks are due to the regular group of contributors and to the Ian Allan Bookshop at Waterloo, the World of Transport Bookshop at Twickenham, and the Inland Waterways bookshop.
